Mr. Suman Bery is former Country Director, India Central – IGC. Since August 2009, he has been a member of both the Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minister, New Delhi and the National Statistical Commission, a body responsible to Indian Parliament for the quality and integrity of India's Statistical System. He is now Chief Economist at Shell. Mr. Bery has served as Director-General (Chief Executive) of the National Council of Applied Economic Research (NCAER), New Delhi from January 2001 to March 2011. NCAER is one of India's leading independent policy research institutions and undertakes social science research under sponsorship from the government, private and international bodies. It is particularly known for its work on economic forecasting, household surveys, infrastructure, trade policy and human development.
