#### **ABOUT THE CONFERENCE**

### MAIN THEME- TECHNOLOGY AND POLICY

Technology has been a transformative force in society over the last several decades and its impact is moderated to a great extent by public policy. Technological advancements have provided valuable opportunities for refining and restructuring the existing public policy framework, along with many other positive implications for society at large. Policy regulates and drives technological interventions as diverse as artificial intelligence, cybersecurity, biotechnology, and digital identity. However, these technological innovations also generate ambiguity and anxiety, which has led to a collective sense of concern about the speed and intensity of these changes, and whether and how they can be harnessed for social benefit. Eventually, how we as an epistemic community prepare for, respond to, and anticipate next steps will be critical for the future of the interface between technology and society. Public policy is critical for shaping technology as a force that raises awareness, assuages fears, builds trust, and opens development pathways for communities. The IPPN annual conference this year draws upon the multidisciplinary nature of this topic to explore critical issues at the intersection of technology and public policy. The conference welcomes research from all disciplines that incorporates this approach.

#### **SUBTHEMES**

#### 1. Sustainable Development Goals

Digital technologies, robotics, artificial intelligence and automation and other technologies like biotechnology and nanotechnology have huge and potential impacts on the growing economy, the society and the environment. These technological impacts are crucial, especially for the developing and the under-developed countries of the world. Technology and its innovations have a special role in the implementation of SDGs. With effective policies and with the help of technology, it is possible to achieve many of the interlinked targets of the SDGs including clean water and sanitation (Goal 6), reduced inequalities (Goal 10), good health and well-being (Goal 3), and decent work and economic growth (Goal 8).

#### 2. Investment in Human Capital

Investment in human capital such as education, innovation and skilling are critical for economic growth, particularly in countries with limited natural resources. Human capital fosters economic growth because investments in it tend to boost productivity. Combined with investment in technology, complementary investments in education, health, and skilling workers leads to high growth rates. However, an imbalance in investments in technology, and human capital could lead uneven distribution of the former's benefits among different social groups. Therefore, investments in human capital need to match and complement technological growth in developing countries.

## 3. Digital Identity and Policy

Digital identities have become an inextricable part of modern society which enable people to uniquely identify themselves to access critical services and participate in contemporary economic, social and political systems. Since an individual can officially have only one digital identity, this uniqueness and exclusivity makes it ideal to be used in digital government services and transactions. However, digital identities could also possibly exclude vulnerable groups, encourage institutionalised discrimination and promote misuse of personal data. For instance; India's Aadhaar- World's largest digital identification system exhibits tremendous potential for development along with unique challenges.

## 4. Direct Benefit Transfers

Direct Benefit Transfer Scheme, designed primarily to reduce subsidy diversion by building a secure payments infrastructure, is being used in over 430 government schemes. Pervasive corruption and evasion in the form of misreporting, leakages and information asymmetries often render public programs inefficient. Policy reforms designed to curb leakages in public programmes need to target the underlying economic incentives which may exacerbate the agency problems and such programs should be carefully evaluated for how they interact with markets. Measuring market effects is policy-relevant for large welfare delivery programmes as well as for policy changes which aim to increase efficiency in welfare delivery.

## 5. Financial Inclusions

Financial inclusion is a necessity. A country cannot afford to become progressive by excluding a certain section of its population out of the financial network system. It is of course a challenge for India where about 30 percent of population do not know how to read and write, percent of population are not able to earn a couple of meals a day and about 20 percent of villages are out of the road network and electricity.

## 6. Covid 19 Response

The pandemic brought in unanticipated challenges and there have been many technological interventions as a response to the pandemic. Research community has recently been documenting some of these interventions and how governments, corporates and civil society have responded and adapted in these critical times. The interventions have been around health, education, economy, social-economic development and governance.
