

Rajeev Malhotra bridges the world of academics and policy making as a civil servant, both at national and international levels. A development economist with over 28 years of experience, he is a full time academic since August 2012. He holds two masters degrees from Delhi School of Economics and London School of Economics and Political Science.

Earlier Rajeev has worked with Government of India at the Planning Commission and at the Ministry of Finance, where, until August 2012, he was Economic Adviser to the then Union Finance Minister. From 2002 to 2008, he was employed at UN office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights in Geneva, where he contributed to operationalization of the Right to Development mandate. He also conceptualized and led the work on development of human rights indicators. Rajeev has trained as macro-economist and has substantial experience of working on macro-econometric models, policy modeling, the formulation of Union Budget and planning process in India. He has been a consultant for Asian Productivity Organization, Tokyo(1994); Commonwealth Secretariat, UK(2002); UN Office of the High Commissioner for Human Rights, Geneva and Kathmandu, Nepal(post-2007); UN Economic and Social Commission for Asia and Pacific, Bangkok (2009); UNDP Bangladesh (2013); FAO (2015); UNDG-UNICEF (2014-15); and UNDP Tunisia (2016) on issues related to project evaluation, planning methodologies, macroeconomic developments, human rights monitoring and rights based approaches in development and SDGs. Rajeev has published on methodological issues in estimation of poverty, human development, human rights indicators, right to development, fiscal policy and specific issues on Indian economy.

He teaches the course on Introduction to Public Policy: Design, Analysis and Implementation and Indian Economic Transformation in Advanced Management Programme in Public Policy.
