MPPP Class of 2018 at the Indian School of Business (ISB) got to a roaring start on April 28, 2017. This residency had three core courses on: Applied Economics for Public Policy Makers, Fundamentals of Design and Implementation of Public Policy, and Infrastructure Policy and Management.
