

# More ISB grads bag global placements

## Average cost-to-company package goes up

Graduates of Indian School of Business (ISB) are going global in larger numbers now if the placements for the year, are any indication. Around 111 students got offers from 50 multinational companies to work in 23 cities across all continents.

Compared to last year, the number of international offers doubled this time from industries such as consulting, manufacturing, real estate and information technology, Mr M. Rammoan Rao, Dean, ISB, told

newspersons here on Wednesday.

### **CTC GOES UP**

Ms Savita Mahajan, Associate Dean and in-charge of placements, said the average Costs to the Company (CTC) offered to ISB graduates, too, had gone up. The average international CTC was \$1.44 lakh a year compared to \$1.35 lakh last year, while the average domestic CTC surged to Rs 19 lakh a year (Rs 15 lakh).

“As a policy, we desist from giving highest/lowest CTC. The growth in the av-

erage international and domestic CTC should be seen in the context of a large number of 415 students who participated in the placements programme,” she said. The Class of 2008 has 422 students, out of whom 12 students preferred to start their own ventures or return to their family businesses.

Four new companies, a medical coding KPO, nanotech for broadband, biotech research outsourcing and financial analytics and consultancy were set up by the students.
