

Privatization and Regulation - A Public Lecture by Prof. B S Ghuman June, 27 (3.00 PM) in Nalanda, ISB Mohali Campus

Bharti Institute of Public Policy organized an interactive session at 3 PM in Nalanda on June 27, with Prof. B S Ghuman, Professor, Department of Public Administration, Panjab University (PU), Chandigarh, and Chief Finance and Economic Adviser to the Government of Punjab. He spoke on “**Privatization and Regulation: The Indian Experience.**” This lecture was part of the distinguished lecture series organised by Bharti Institute of Public Policy, ISB, on major Public Policy issues that concern India and the global community. This lecture was co-sponsored by the ISB Public Policy Club.

Professor B.S. Ghuman is Professor at the Department of Public Administration, Panjab University (PU), Chandigarh. He is also Chief Finance and Economic Adviser to Government of Punjab. A distinguished academician, he has 37 years’ of teaching, research, advisory and training experience to his credit. He has published 70 papers and 3 books. His recent paper titled, “Decentralization and Delivery of Public Services in Asia” published in Policy and Society (an international peer-reviewed journal with H Index 11, published by Elsevier Publications, The Netherlands) clearly demonstrates high quality of Professor Ghuman’s research. Recently he has co-edited a book on higher education titled, Higher Education in India: The Changing Scenario. He has guided 14 Ph.D. theses and 17 M. Phil dissertations, many in the area of Privatization and Regulation.

Professor Ghuman has extensive international academic experience. He was member of Executive Council of Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute (SICI- a bi-national organization promoting Indo-Canadian Studies). He is Adjunct Professor at Department of Economics, University of the Fraser Valley (UFV), British Columbia, Canada. He is Associate of the Centre for Business and Public Sector Ethics, Cambridge, UK and Senior Associate, Centre for Indo-Canadian Studies, UFV, Canada.
